

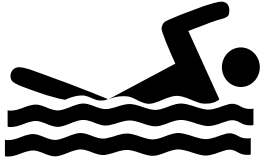

ADULT SWIM LAPS

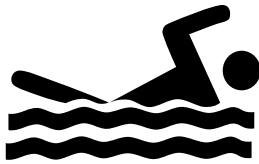

AN INTRODUCTION TO AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE

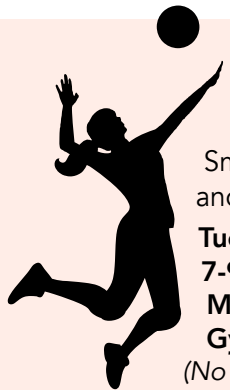

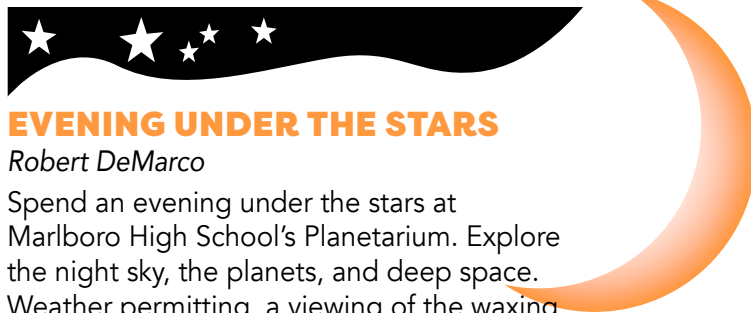

THE DSLR (DIGITAL SINGLE LENS REFLEX) CAMERA

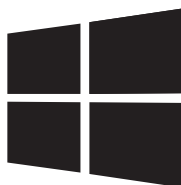
